NOT in Recycle BIN

*Items bring to Recycle Center

- * Batteries
- Bio-hazardous waste
- Cables
- Ceramics (Toilets, tile, drywall)
- Clothes (bins located at all schools)
- Construction debris**
- Diapers
- Dishes or mirrors
- Egg cartons
- * Electronics
- Food or liquid**
- Greasy food containers**
- Hardback books
- Hazardous waste
- Holiday decorations
- Hoses**
- Ice cream cartons (wax-coated)
- * Lightbulbs
- Plastic bags**
- Plastic food wrappers
- Plastic straws
- Plastic without numbers
- Polystyrene foam
- * Scrap metal

YES RECYCLE BIN

Cardboard (boxes broken down), Newspaper & Magazines
Recycle newspaper inserts, catalogs, paperback books, phone books and brochures.

Paper Food Containers & Cartons

Recycle juice boxes, egg, ice cream and milk cartons, and cereal and pasta boxes.

Paper

Recycle envelopes, office paper, junk mail, greeting cards and file folders. Shredded paper should be put in a paper bag.

Glass

Recycle clear, brown and green bottles and jars.

Metal Cans Recycle all food and beverage metal cans—steel, tin, bi-metal and aluminum.

Plastics

Recycle plastics #1, #2 and #5. Look on the bottom of containers for the number inside the recycling arrows

RECYCLE CENTER

Electronics- (Essentially anything with a cord); TVs, computers, monitors, AC's, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, microwaves, small appliances, washing machines, dryers, dishwashes, ect.

Metals- Gas grills (remove propane) lawn mowers (remove gas), metal fence and posts

Comingled- Glass bottles, tin cans, aluminum containers, rigid plastic containers #1, 2 and 5 (all need to be rinsed out)

Large Plastic Items- kid's toys, plastic patio furniture etc.

Cardboard- Broken down (lays flat), NO Pizza boxes!

Styrofoam- white, packaging coolers, (no PEANUTS)

Yard Debris- Grass, sticks and limbs <less than 2" in diameter

Mercury Products- Fluorescent bulbs, CFLs, thermostats, thermometers (with silver liquid)
